SECTION 6

REMEMBER ➤➤➤



The Present Continuous tense is used in questions about the future and when you are sure of your plans. The Present Continuous is used with a specific time. For example:

‘What are you doing tonight?’ ‘I’m watching TV tonight.’

Are you coming to class tomorrow?

‘Going to’ is also used in questions and when you are sure. ‘Going to’ can be used without a specific time. For example:

‘What are you doing tonight?’ ‘I’m going to watch TV tonight.’

‘I hate my job.’ ‘Really? What are you going to do?’

‘Will’ is used when you are not sure and with the verb ‘be’. For example:

‘What are you doing tonight?’ ‘I’m not sure, maybe I’ll go out or perhaps I’ll stay home.’

‘Will you be here tomorrow?’ ‘No, I won’t be here tomorrow.’
